

Online Consent Requests in Whole Game System

July 2017

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Within Player Registration, functionality has been provided to allow clubs to request that their players "provide consent" (i.e. give their signature to play for a club for the season) online, as well as confirming "offline consent" (the club has a registration form signed by the club). Either can be provided to record that a player has agreed to play for the club.

If the player is under 16 years of age, a parent or guardian with an email address will need to be associated with the player record to gain online consent.

When a club "Requests Consent" against a player, Whole Game System will validate that there is an email address associated with the player's FAN record.



If there is no email address associated with the player, then an error message will be displayed informing the club that there is no email address and consequently the online consent request cannot be generated.

Assuming that there is an email address present, then the consent request will be generated, which is visible on the Portal to the club as Consent Pending.



When this consent request is generated, a Portal Notification will be generated for the player concerned, asking them to confirm they wish to play for the club.



Additionally, within an hour (this used to be overnight, but has been updated from 7th July 2017 onwards to be an hourly process) of the notification being generated in the Portal, an automated

email will be sent to the player informing them that an "Important" notification has been generated for them, and that they should login to the Whole Game System Portal. Note that if the player has already logged in and acknowledged their notification this automated email will not be sent.

This email will include their FAN record, but the delivery of the email is dependent on the user's email account not blocking the automated email, or marking it as spam.

If the email is blocked or marked as spam, the user will have to resolve it themselves, either via their ISP or their spam filter.

player of their FAN number (visible to the club in the Portal) and inform them they need to login and confirm their consent.




To login to the Whole Game System, the individual will first need to retrieve/reset their password.

The individual should go to the sign in page (https://wholegame.thefa.com) and then click on the link marked "Have you forgotten your password".

This will then open up the FA Password Reset page, which will ask the player to provide their email address and date of birth, and submit the request for the automated email to be sent to them to reset their password.

This process is dependent on the correct date of birth and correct email address being associated with the player's record. If either of these is incorrect, the player will not be able to request the password reset and whilst the club can correct an email address, they



will have to contact their County FA to amend an incorrect date of birth.



Once the player has reset their password, they can login to the Whole Game System Portal.


Once they have logged in, they should stay on their Home tab and navigate to the "Club Requests" button towards the bottom of the pillar.

If a parent is logging in to give consent on behalf of their children then they will have a link called "Children" and should click on that.





The Club Requests page will appear, showing the club (or clubs) which have requested that the player provides consent to play for them.



The player can click on the "Approve" and the consent is given and will be updated for the club to see in the Whole Game System Portal.



Offline Consent in Whole Game System

Although online consent will generally be a more efficient process for clubs and players to manage their consent, an offline option has to be available, to cater for players who do not have access to email, whose email systems may block automated emails or who otherwise wish to sign a registration form rather than confirm online.

If a club wishes to record that consent has been provided "Offline" then they should select the player (or players) and click on the option marked "Confirm Offline Consent".



There is no follow-up process for this. The player's consent will be updated immediately to be shown

as Consent: Accepted Offline and by doing so, the club are confirming that they have a registration form signed by the player. If the league wish to ask for this at a later date, they may do so, but this is a process outside of Whole Game System.



Whilst we would encourage clubs and leagues to get as many players to consent online as possible, we would strongly advise that some players will need to consent offline. There is not an option to disable the Offline Consent.
